

Formal GOP Structure

Federal: The Republican National Committee. The National Committee Members are elected for each state by that state's State Committee Members. The National Committee nominates the Presidential candidate. <https://www.gop.com/>



State: Republican Party of Pennsylvania. Elected State Committee Members from each county. The number of State Committee Members from each county is based on population. The State Chairman is elected by the State Committee Members. The Chair of each county committee is also a member of the State Committee. There are Regional Caucuses with chairs as well. The State Committee endorses candidates running for state-wide office. <http://www.pagop.org/>



County: Cumberland County Republican Committee: Chairman elected by the Precinct Committee Members. County Committee endorses candidates running for county-wide office. <https://www.gopccpa.org/>



Clubs: like the Western Cumberland County Republican Club are separate entities from the county's formal GOP structure which is the role of the Cumberland County Republican Committee. Our Club works in synergy and collaboration with the county Committee.

It is important to remember endorsed candidates have been vetted, interviewed, and voted on by the full committee at whatever level the endorsement is at. The endorsement process is extremely thorough, tedious, and valuable. The threshold for endorsement is high.

To briefly summarize the goal of the Western Cumberland County Republican Club, it is to: (1) register new Republican voters, (2) support Republicans, and (3) elect Republicans!!!
